



### Cause #1 - Immigration

No one leaves a place they love without reasons.

- Reasons for leaving are broken into two categories: push factors and pull factors.
  - A push factor is a reason for leaving.
  - A pull factor is a reason for coming.
- Based on our studies so far, list some reasons of each type.

<b><u>Push Factors</u></b> Reasons wanted to leave	<b><u>Pull Factors</u></b> Reasons attracted to colonies
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● The Thirty Years' War                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Between Catholic and Protestant nations</li> <li>○ Kills over 8 million people</li> <li>○ Destroys the economy of Europe - putting many out of work</li> </ul> </li> <li>● The Monarch (king) and the nobility own all of the land                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Those who live on and work the land must give upwards of 80% of what they harvest to the nobleman who controls the land as rent</li> <li>○ Making them peasants, not farmers</li> </ul> </li> <li>● Social classes are fixed                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ One is born into and dies in the same social class</li> <li>○ Most do the same work as their father</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● No religious warfare                             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ In some colonies - colonists of different religions live alongside each other peacefully                                     <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>■ Rhode Island</li> <li>■ Pennsylvania</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> <li>● There is no nobility</li> <li>● People of all social class can own land, farm</li> <li>● Many indentured servants get land as part of their freedom dues</li> </ul>
