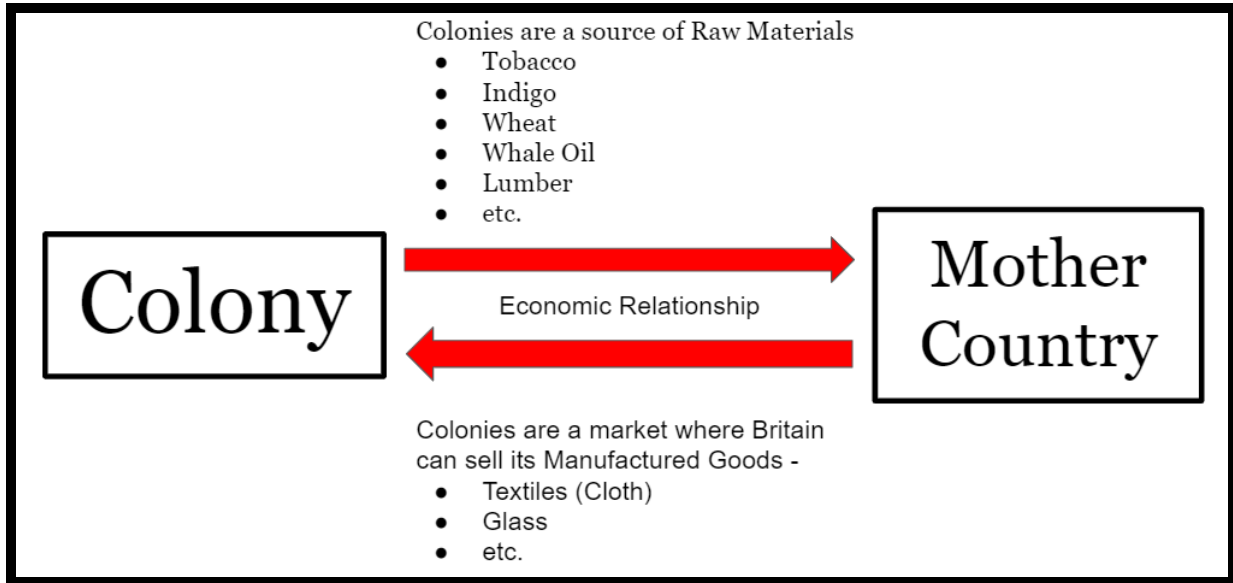

Primary Source - Excerpt #1 from Navigation Acts passed by Parliament September 13, 1660

Vocabulary -

- o “plantations” - colonies

<p>Navigation Act of September 13, 1660</p> <p>For the increase of shipping and encouragement of the navigation of this nation wherein, . . . the wealth, safety, and strength of this kingdom is so much concerned;</p> <p>be it enacted by the king’s most excellent Majesty, and by the Lords and Commons in this present Parliament assembled,</p> <p>. . . no goods or commodities whatsoever shall be imported into or exported out of any lands, islands, plantations, or territories to his Majesty belonging or in his possession, . . . in Asia, Africa, or America,</p> <p>. . . but in such ships or vessels as do truly and without fraud belong only to the people of England or Ireland, or dominion of Wales, or are built of and belonging to any the said lands, islands, plantations, or territories, as the proprietors and right owners thereof,</p> <p>and whereof the master and three fourths of the mariners at least are English;</p>	<p>Express the key ideas of the five parts excerpt in your own words</p>

Primary Source - Excerpt #2 from Navigation Acts passed by Parliament September 13, 1660

<p>And it is further enacted by the authority aforesaid,</p> <p>that . . . no sugars, tobacco, cotton-wool, indigoes, ginger, fustic, or other dyeing wood, of the growth, production, or manufacture of any English plantations in America, Asia, or Africa,</p> <p>shall be shipped, carried, conveyed, or transported from any of the said English plantations to any land, island, territory, dominion, port, or place whatsoever, other than to such other English plantations as do belong to his Majesty, . . . or to the kingdom of England or Ireland, or principality of Wales,</p>	<p>Express the key ideas of the three parts of this excerpt in your own words.</p>
